

Bachelor Degree Programme

1. Academic Year

The Academic Year is divided into two semesters, each comprising 13 weeks of teaching and one week of revision, followed by an examination period. Some programmes may have a Summer Term of 7 weeks. For details, please refer to https://www.uowchk.edu.hk/academic-calendar-and-important-dates.

2. Tuition Fees

The tuition fees of Bachelor Degree programmes are charged as a variable fee according to the number of credit units taken in each semester. For new students, the non-refundable Acceptance Fee paid at the time of admission is credited towards the tuition fees upon enrolment. The balance of the tuition fees required for the first semester of study will be collected after the course add/drop period. From second semester onwards, students are normally required to pay a minimum tuition fee of two credit units before start of the next semester. The balance of the tuition fees chargeable for the semester will be collected after the course add/drop period.

The standard tuition fees for this programme are:

Year I - \$69,000

Year II - \$69,000

3. Non-means-tested Subsidy Scheme for Self-financing Undergraduate Studies in Hong Kong

Under the Non-means-tested Subsidy Scheme for Self-financing Undergraduate Studies in Hong Kong (NMTSS), a non-means-tested annual subsidy will be provided to Hong Kong students who have attained:

- (a) "3322" in the Hong Kong Diploma for Secondary Education Examination (i.e. level 3 for Chinese Language and English Language and level 2 for Mathematics Compulsory Part and Liberal Studies); or
- (b) sub-degree qualifications (i.e. after completing relevant locally-accredited Associate Degree or Higher Diploma programmes)

Both new and continuing students meeting the criteria are eligible for the subsidy, which is tenable for the normal duration of the programmes concerned. The amount of subsidy for 2021/22 academic year is HK\$33,100. Eligible students enrolled in the relevant programmes will pay a tuition fee after subsidy. 4. Financial Assistance

Apart from NMTSS, students in need may still apply for assistance from the Government's Working Family and Student Financial Assistance Agency (WFSFAA):

- a) Financial Assistance Scheme for Post-secondary Students (FASP), and/or
- b) Non-means Tested Loan Scheme for Post-secondary Students (NLSPS).

6. Student Experience Enrichment Activities

The College recognizes the importance of different forms of learning in forging students' personal growth and development. Students are sponsored to take part in Study Abroad Scheme and Overseas Study Tours, not only to deepen their understanding of the main areas of study, but also to enhance their language skills and open their eyes to different cultures. The College also sponsors local co-curricular activities, enriching students' learning experience.

Students in receipt of government financial assistance can apply for EDB subsidy schemes. EDB subsidizes exchange activities that are related to disciplines of studies or a language immersion programme, and are organized or endorsed by the College. 7. Sports Facilities

The College actively supports its students in sports for the benefit of enhancing students' campus life, promoting a healthy lifestyle, and providing a platform to build relationships and confidence. Students are entitled to use the sports facilities at Spotlight Recreation Club (Whampoa Gardens). Fitness Center at Telford Recreation Club offers students a diverse range of group physical fitness classes such as Yoga, Boxing and Indoor Cycling led by professional instructors.

8. Medical and Dental Services

Students can enjoy the out-patient medical and dental panels of UOWCHK, with details as follows:

Medical

- UMP Medical Centre (Kowloon Bay, Jordan, Tsim Sha Tsui and Causeway Bay)
- Co-payment: HK\$13 per consultation
- General Consultation (Including 3 days of basic medication)
- 1 visit per day
- A maximum of 20 visits per year

Dental

- UMP Dental Centre (Central / Jordan) / Dr. Lee Pak Cheung Patrick & Associates
- Co-payment: HK\$98 per 20-minute session
- A maximum of 2 visits per year
